The Centre will notify the applicants of its decision until **12 July 2021**.

CETAPS is a dynamic research centre that brings together 50 integrated members and 94 collaborators (for the most part young researchers doing their doctoral or postdoctoral training at the research unit) from 11 Portuguese institutions of higher education, promoting research and activities with high national and international reach. It was graded as Excellent in the FCT 2013-2017 Evaluation (current).

As of 2020, CETAPS is leading a [CIPSH chair on Digital Humanities in Education](#). CETAPS has two branches, one in Lisbon, at the NOVA School of Social Sciences and Humanities, and the other in Porto, at the Faculty of Arts and Humanities of University of Porto, in Portugal.
